### CIT Campus – Woden Construction Look Ahead




A new town centre precinct is coming to Woden. It will bring state of the art learning facilities, a safer, light rail ready public transport interchange, improved active travel and more green spaces on Woden's eastern side. Construction in the Woden Town Centre is increasing. This construction look ahead provides a summary of expected activity in the work zones to July 2022.



Road and intersection upgrades are underway throughout Woden.

#### **Progress** so far





#### In the Construction Zone

Over the coming months, construction works for the CIT Campus - Woden project will continue to focus on the utilities, verge and road works required to support two new local bus layover areas and the future public transport interchange.


Along Callam Street our priority is relocating services and prepping the carriageway for construction of the transport interchange. These early works will be ongoing throughout 2022.

Meanwhile on Launceston Street works are centred on the required road and

intersection upgrades to accommodate future bus, light rail and private vehicle movements through the area. There are also a number of upgrades to Easty Street as we progress towards having the new bus layover operational before the end of the year.

These works are having an impact on the road network, traffic flows and active travel routes to, from and around the Woden Town Centre. See further detail overleaf to help you plan ahead.

# Building new bus layover and driver facilities

We are relocating the bus layover and driver facilities away from the Woden Town Centre to provide more opportunity for inviting public space and better activation around the CIT campus.

Before the end of the year two new layover areas will be operational, with one located along Easty Street and the other located off Launceston Street adjacent to Phillip Oval.

Works on these new facilities are progressing well. On Easty Street, upgrades to the water connection will soon be finalised allowing pavement and road works to be completed. Meanwhile at the Launceston Street layover, the new driver amenities building is nearing completion and focus will soon shift to laying inground services, commencing concrete pours and establishing infrastructure at the layover's entry and exit points.

Until these new layover areas are ready to support bus operations, an expanded temporary layover adjacent to the Matilda Street carpark will be used.

### New and upgraded local intersections

Road and intersection upgrades are continuing in the Woden Town Centre in preparation for a new public transport interchange on Callam Street. This includes:

- > the intersection at Launceston and Easty streets, which has now been signalised
- the intersection at Launceston and Callam streets, which is currently being upgraded and will soon be signalised
- the intersection at Launceston and Bowes streets, which will soon include a righthand signalised turn.

To allow these upgrades to occur, Launceston Street will remain closed to private vehicles between Bowes and Easty streets until August.

The closure of Launceston Street means your journey into Woden may need to change.

Motorists travelling southbound are encouraged to use Melrose Drive to access the Woden Town Centre. Easty Street is also now open to private vehicles in both directions and can be used as an alternative access point.

During this time buses will operate as usual.

## Changes for walking in and around Woden

There are changes at several pedestrian crossings along Launceston Street while the road is closed. This includes the signalised pedestrian crossing at the intersection of Launceston and Callam streets which will be unavailable until around August. To replace this crossing and provide access across the construction zone, an alternative pedestrian crossing is now operational at the intersection of Matilda and Callam streets.

With the Matilda Street pedestrian crossing now open, planning is underway to close the signalised pedestrian crossing at the intersection of Callam and Bowes streets in June. With a lot of buses, pedestrians and construction traffic using the area at the same time, this crossing is being closed to make the area safer. Pedestrians and cyclists are now encouraged to use the alternative crossings at Matilda Street or Bradley Street.

Meanwhile, works are also continuing to improve the footpaths along Easty Street. Watch this space as new paving and landscaping works are completed along both verges.
