ENGLISH SKILLS FOR NEW CANBERRA KIDS

Students who are new to Australia can access introductory English classes at selected ACT public schools.

Students spend two terms working on their language and social skills and learning about the culture of Australian schools, before moving into mainstream classes.

There are currently more than 270 children from Canberra's migrant, refugee and diplomat families getting a head start in language and culture at one of Canberra's six Introductory English Centres.

VOTE FOR NEW PARK NAME

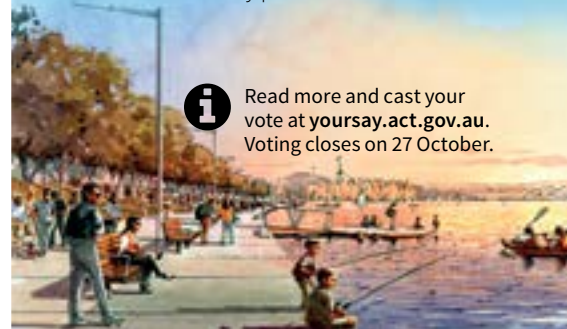


Canberra's newest public park is set to open at West Basin in early 2018 and you can help choose its name.

Members of the ACT Place Names Committee have nominated four people who played a role in the development of the region for the public to select from.

These include a convict-turned-land manager, John McLoughlin, landscaper Dame Sylvia Crowe, architect and amateur artist Henry Rolland OBE, or the founder of *The Queanbeyan Age* John Gale.

With 23,000 plants, grassed areas, barbecue facilities, public art, connected walkways and access to the new public boardwalk on the lake's edge, the park will be a focal recreational destination in the city precinct.

A NEW PUBLIC HOLIDAY FOR CANBERRANS



The ACT will celebrate its first Reconciliation Day in May 2018.

The public holiday will replace September's Family and Community Day. It will take place on the first Monday on or after 27 May each year, the anniversary of the 1967 referendum and the first day of National Reconciliation Week.

NEW BUS TIMETABLE STARTS 7 OCTOBER



A new bus timetable starts in Canberra on Saturday 7 October.

Key changes include:

- > New Green Rapid service between the City to Woden via Barton (Route 6)
- > Free travel on the Green Rapid for the first two months
- > The introduction of services through the new Dickson Interchange
- > Service improvements across the weekend, including on the Red Rapid 7 day a week high frequency service between Gungahlin and the City

Minor changes have also been made to dedicated school services. ACT schools will receive advice on any changes that affect them.

You will automatically be issued with a valid month-long temporary licence that you can download while a new licence is posted to you.

CANBERRA'S LIGHT RAIL UPDATE

Intersection closures and diversions are in place as work continues on stage 1 of light rail between Gungahlin and the City. To keep on top of the changes you can subscribe to our light rail construction update via transport.act.gov.au.

CANBERRA PUBLIC TRANSPORT AREAS NOW SMOKE-FREE



Canberrans can now breathe a little easier with all ACT public transport areas now smoke-free. This includes smoking or vaping within five metres of bus and train stations, light rail transport hubs and taxi ranks.

This change will protect people from exposure to second hand smoke and reduce the exposure of children and young people to seeing people smoke.

UC HOSPITAL'S REHABILITATION COURTYARD



A courtyard at the new University of Canberra Public Hospital will provide a new treatment setting to help rehabilitate people after injury.


The new courtyard is now complete and incorporates varying heights, surfaces and textures. This offers patients a realistic setting for rehabilitation. It also has a motionless car for people wishing to practice transferring into and out of a car as part of their rehabilitation.

The hospital will be Canberra's first purpose-built rehabilitation hospital and remains on track for completion in 2018.
