How to use this document

This Action Plan contains revised targets and actions for each of the four key principles of the City Renewal Authority's Sustainability Strategy 2021-2025:

1. Resilience and climate-wise design
2. Social and economic vibrancy
3. Sustainable use of resources
4. Active healthy living and travel

The Action Plan outlines the key actions that the Authority needs to undertake to achieve the objectives of the Strategy. It will guide the Authority's project teams to:

- consider the economic, social and environmental sustainability targets set out in the Strategy;
- implement actions through the Authority's work program and business as usual (BAU); and
- evaluate and report on the Authority's progress in achieving the Strategy's objectives.

Targets and Actions

Targets were reviewed and assigned specific, achievable and measurable actions that are delivery and/or advocacy focussed.

Baselines and Reporting

Some actions require baseline and subsequent measurements to report on the Authority's performance in implementing the Strategy. These measurements will be recorded in the Sustainable Design & Delivery checklist and reported throughout program and project lifecycles. A progress report will be produced annually until the completion of the Strategy in 2025.

The following key is used to indicate which actions need to be measured as an indication of achievement for reporting, and which actions are included in a corresponding checklist for implementation.

Themes

Themes are identified for each target (some targets may have more than one theme) to ensure the Authority is applying a balanced triple bottom line approach to sustainability:

- Environmental (total 15),
- Social (total 16),
- Economic (total 15).

CRA Role and Responsibility

The Design and Place Strategy team will be responsible for oversight of the Action Plan and reporting. All staff and contractors of the Authority are responsible for implementing the actions that are relevant to their core business.

The Authority's role in implementing actions is identified as:

- delivery focussed – achieving sustainable urban renewal outcomes through public realm design, construction and activation projects, and land sales and development within the CRA precinct; and/or
- advocacy focussed – supporting the delivery of sustainability targets and aspirations through the Authority's role as a referral agency in the land development process and creating public awareness through running placemaking events, activation programs and communicating our sustainability achievements in urban renewal projects to the community.

**Caring for Country activities that may be relevant to urban renewal and development include:

- adopting sustainable land and water use practices to protect the integrity of Country and reduce the impacts of natural events, such as fire, flooding and drought;
- protecting and enhancing species diversity, e.g. using native, climate-wise and cultural plant species in landscaping; and
- protecting culturally sensitive sites to ensure First Nations heritage and practices are preserved.

Appropriate Caring for Country activities that improve the health and wellbeing of Country in an urban context can be identified through engagement with First Nations communities (refer to actions under Principle 2 – Objective 3).

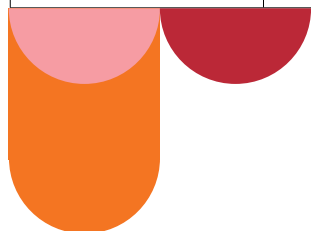
