

New bus network starts 29 April



Canberra's new bus network will start operating on Monday 29 April, in time for the start of school term two.

Local services in Gungahlin will provide frequent, reliable connections to the Gungahlin Town Centre from all suburbs in the region, including the introduction of services into Moncrieff, Taylor and Throsby. From Gungahlin Place, customers can easily transfer to

light rail using the same ticket, for services via Flemington Road and Northbourne Avenue to Dickson and Civic, or Rapid 8 bus services to Belconnen.

Give the new network a try with FREE travel during the first month for passengers using a MyWay card.

The new network will start later this month and includes more bus services on weekends and at night. We are significantly increasing our rapid bus network, with seven new routes providing services every 15 minutes between our town centres and CBD.

The Centenary Hospital for Women and Children provides vital healthcare to women, children and adolescents from Canberra and the regions. Since opening in 2012, thousands of babies have also been delivered at the hospital.

Important upgrades and expansions continue this year. These will provide more special care nursery cots, inpatient beds, a new adolescent gynaecology area and mental health unit.

Raising building standards

Exams for new Class A, B and C builders are now mandatory to be licenced in the ACT.

Some builders renewing their licenses will also need to sit the exam. This is part of an initiative to raise building standards in the ACT.

You can also check if a builder has been subject to any disciplinary activity in the past 10 years by searching on the Disciplinary Register.
