Mpox (for selected Pharmacies only)	JYNNEOS	Non-pregnant people aged 16 years and older	Administer in accordance with the ACT JYNNEOS vaccination protocol.

The above ACT funded vaccines are available for free for eligible people in addition to the National Immunisation Program (NIP) Pharmacy Schedule.

Please note that ACT funded program vaccines cannot be claimed under the National Immunisation Program Vaccinations in Pharmacy (NIPVIP) program.

### Before vaccinating:

- National Immunisation Program vaccine and ACT funded program vaccines must only be administered to eligible people.
- Always review the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) to check the patient's previous immunisation history.
- Check the online Australian Immunisation Handbook (*the Handbook*) or download the Handbook app for information about vaccinations at <a href="https://immunisationhandbook.health.gov.au">https://immunisationhandbook.health.gov.au</a>

Check the correct vaccine dose number and batch number have been recorded and report all vaccinations to AIR as soon as possible
